Slowdown at the Sausage Factory

As the month of July drew to a close, members of the House of Representatives looked forward to leaving the sweltering, politicallytainted Capitol and returning to the virtuous sanctity of their home districts for a supposedlydeserved five-week recess.

A great problem loomed, however. Lurking on our southern border was a seething horde of juvenile delinquents, unvaccinated, disease-ridden — perhaps even carrying the deadly Ebola virus.

Speaker of the House John Boehner [R-OH] put forward a \$659 million emergency spending bill on Thursday, July 31st which would have expedited the deportation of these pestilential children.

Recent changes in House leadership, though, seem to have doomed his effort.

Eric Cantor [R-VA], the erstwhile House Majority Leader, had never been a particularly trustworthy second-in-command. The two were often seen in the same room, but rarely with Boehner's back turned towards Cantor, who clearly coveted his boss's job.

Boehner did not have to worry about Cantor when it came time to vote on the immigration bill; Cantor had suffered a shocking primary election defeat in June to David Brat, a hardcore Tea Party candidate. But the Minority Leader's place had been taken by someone with even greater ambitions, apparently, and, to confuse the issue further, he was from the other chamber.

Ted Cruz, a Republican Senator from Texas, was organizing the House's Tea Party caucus to put the kibosh on Boehner's border bill on the grounds that it would not have deported children

fast enough.

Will Rogers used to say, "I don't belong to any organized political party — I'm a Democrat." On July 31st, almost eighty years after Rogers' death, his aphorism seemed equally applicable to the GOP.

After spending the last several months talking up the border threat, House Republicans had just voted to do nothing constructive. Naturally, their primary concern was how that might look to voters in the coming general election, just 90 days away.

So, on a day when they could have been at home basking in the admiration of their constituents, House Republicans were instead on Capitol Hill, crafting and passing an immigration bill. It will, in fact, do nothing about immigration; because no matching bill would ever pass in the Senate. Further, if any such a bill were to pass, it would be vetoed in

Passage of the bill, however, will perform one vital function: it will allow House Republicans to say that they passed a fierce and draconian bill. Having dutifully accomplished that much, they fled.

A Tax Cut for the Poor Rich

Reflecting on such behavior, a cynic might say that Congress has accomplished nothing this term. To the contrary, it had recently contrived a way to apply a tax break far more "fairly."

Since 1998, the Child Tax Credit [CTC] has given lowincome patrents a tax break of up to \$1,000 per child. According to compassionate conservatives like Rep. Dave Camp (R-MI), the time had come to "make some simple improvements to the child tax credit, so it keeps up with the



cost of raising children."

According to the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities [CBPP], under the CTC Improvement Act of 2014, passed on July 25th, "couples with two children making between \$150,000 and \$205,000 would become newly eligible for the credit; a family making \$150,000 a year would receive a new tax cut of \$2,200 in 2018."

Of course, every quid must have its quo. Somebody's got to pay. Guess who? "A single mother with two children who works full time throughout the year at the minimum wage and earns \$14,500 would lose \$1,725 in 2018, as her CTC would be eliminated," according to CBPP.

That's not all. Parents who pay income taxes but are ineligible for Social Security numbers — read undocumented workers - who used to be able to use their Individual Taxpayer Identification Numbers to qualify for the tax

break, cannot do so any longer. No tax break for them.

Do As We Say — No, Don't

Further perplexing those with a rudimentary grasp of logic, Republicans left town admonishing President Obama to take executive action to "do something" about the border — while simultaneously threatening to sue him for exceeding his authority.

Congress—What Is It Good For?

Mark Twain famously said, "no man's life, liberty, or property are safe while the legislature is in session." If only the converse were true and its absence from the Capitol assured our safety.

A Congress that functioned as intended — allow us to delve into science fiction here - could, among other things, repeal a few tax breaks for billionaires and put the proceeds towards research on a vaccine against the Ebola virus.

Vox.com reported July 31st that "according to Daniel Bausch, a Tulane professor who researches Ebola and other infectious diseases ... really significant progress" is being made towards such a vaccine.

"The obstacle ... isn't the science ... the problem, instead, is the economics of drug development. Pharmaceutical companies have little incentive to pour research and development dollars into curing a disease that surfaces sporadically in low-income, African countries. They aren't likely to see a large pay-off at the end and could stand to lose money."

Phil Gingrey, [R-GA] the Representative most worried about Ebola at the Border, is also a steadfast protector of the rights of knuckle-draggers who oppose mandatory vaccinations - and he's reputed to be an M.D.

Last March, Sen. Diane Fein- CIA employees, two lawyers and up an internal accountability paign money, but he soon went stein [D-CA] charged that CIA operatives had hacked into the computers supposedly-secure of Senate staffers attempting to oversee the CIA.

CIA Director John Brennan responded on March 11th with a furious denial: "As far as the allegations ... nothing could be further from the truth. We wouldn't do that. I mean, that's just beyond the, you know, the scope of reason in terms of what we do."

Brennan's denial is no longer an operative statement. In a threehour private briefing on July 31st, McClatchy reported, CIA Inspector General David Buckley told members of the Senate Intelligence Committee that "five

three information technology specialists improperly accessed or 'caused access' to a database that only committee staff were permitted to use."

While rooting around in the computer's database, CIA employees did keyword searches of Senate staffers' emails "and reviewed some of them."

For good measure, CIA employees provided "inaccurate information" to the Justice Department, alleging that Senate staffers had "removed classified documents from a top-secret facility without authorization."

Brennan apologized to Feinstein and Sen. Saxby Chambliss [R-GA] and said he would "set

board to review the issue [and] recommend 'potential disciplinary measures' and 'steps to address systemic issues." The board will be led by former Democratic Senator Evan Bayh of Indiana.

It appeared to be a remarkable turnaround for the apparentlychastened Brennan. But was it?

As journalist Matt Stoller [@ matthewstoller] tweeted, "CIA apologizes for spying on Congress, hires corporate lobbyist/Fox News contributor Evan Bayh to oversee reforms."

Bayh had left the Senate as a man of principle, writing a scathing critique of that institution's out-of-control filibusters and the influence of anonymous camover to the dark side.

Ezra Klein wrote in March of 2011 that Bayh had gone to work for McGuire Woods, a "massive" law firm whose clients include "national energy companies, foreign countries, international manufacturing companies, trade associations and local and national businesses."

Bayh also became "a senior adviser to Apollo Management Group, a giant public-equity firm. And, finally ... he joined Fox News as a contributor. It's as if he's systematically ticking off every poison he identified in the body politic and rushing to dump more of it into the water supply."

Our paper of July 25th erroneously stated that FAA Regulation 91.119 (b), requiring aircraft to maintain "an altitude of 1,000 feet above the highest obstacle within a horizontal radius of 2,000 feet of the aircraft" over congested areas, applies to helicopters.

It does not. Paragraph (d)(1) of that same regulation, pertaining to "Helicopters, powered parachutes, and weight-shift-control aircraft," provides that "A helicopter may be operated at less than the minimums prescribed in paragraph (b) ... provided each person operating the helicopter complies with any routes or altitudes specifically prescribed for helicopters by the FAA"

of 2011. Had he waited three months he could have really teed off. In June of 2011, the Center for Public Integrity revealed that Bayh had teamed up with former George W. Bush spokesperson Andy Card to form what its backers were calling a bipartisan "road show," touting the alleged benefits of "regulatory reform."

The backers of this venture? The U.S. Chamber of Commerce. Based on that outfit's track record, a more appropriate descriptor of the Bayh/Card effort would be "snake oil show."

If Sen. Feinstein invites the allegedly-chastened Brennan over to the Senate for tea, she should be sure to count the spoons when he leaves.

Punished for Compliance

Speaking in Prague in 2009, President Obama declared, "I state clearly and with conviction America's commitment to seek the peace and security of a world

without nuclear weapons."

Four years later, in February of 2013, a contractor for the Los Alamos National Laboratory named James E. Doyle wrote an article — on his own time — expanding on that speech in Prague.

"Obama, and others who seek a world without nuclear weapons, are right," Doyle wrote. "Eliminating nuclear weapons is profoundly in the national-security interest of the United States and its allies and friends." Doyle challenged prevailing myths that favor the retention of nuclear weapons, re-assessed the risks of maintaining nuclear arsenals, and proposed a target date for their elimination: 34 years hence, in 2045, on the 100th anniversary of the bombing of Hiroshima.

Doyle submitted his article to the laboratory's security officers, who approved it for publication. It was printed in the February issue of a professional journal called Survival: Global Politics and Strategy, and was posted online February 1, 2013.



Little did Doyle know the trouble he would reap for supporting official U.S. policy. A few days after the article went online his manager requested copies of everything he'd ever published. Then a Security Inquiries Team visited and informed him that his article contained classified information. His home computer was searched. His pay was docked. His "Q" Clearance was suspended.

Doyle was finally fired on July 8th, one day after the Center for Public Integrity [CPI], which reported this story on July 31st, called Los Alamos to inquire about "the dispute."

Doyle was a 17-year employee with a spotless record — why was he really canned?

"It was a sensitive moment for an anti-nuclear message to emerge from within the lab," according to CPI's article. "During this period, Los Alamos officials and their Republican supporters on the House Armed Services committee were trying to find the funds for a new \$6.5 billion factory at Los Alamos for plutonium 'pits,' the baseball-sized spheres that form the core of most nuclear weapons."

The Market Basket Saga (cont.)

For almost two weeks Market Basket's stores, normally packed with people, have looked more like sets for a zombie movie: eerily quiet with empty shelves and hardly a soul in sight.

Strangest of all: in a chromeplated stand that would typically hold a sign saying "buy this" or "buy that," a hand-drawn placard read, "Please Boycott M[arket] B[asket] for A[rthur] T. D[emoulas]!"

On Tuesday, at least, it was clear where everybody was: down in Tewksbury, at company headquarters. According to press reports, about 12,000 of the company's employees, along with their supporters and customers, rallied there to demand reinstatement of fired CEO Arthur T. Demoulas.

It's a story whose "man bites dog" appeal has now crossed the Atlantic. Brian Groom, a reporter for London's Financial Times, wrote about Market Basket on Monday, "in four decades of following industrial relations, I had not come across a case of workers striking in support of a sacked chief executive."

This amazing struggle is, in a

way, reminiscent of Occupy Wall Street: no one saw it coming, but when it arrived people were transfixed. It's all about how we divvy up the profits in a capitalist sys-

Occupy Wall Street changed the way Americans think about the economy. After decades in which people shrugged off massive inequalities in income, many people now ask, "Why?"

If Arthur T. prevails, maybe the Market Basket Mutiny will have a similar effect on the way we see corporations. In the cutthroat grocery business, Arthur T. won an unprecedented degree of loyalty from his employees and his customers by treating them all with dignity; as if they mattered.

Why can't other bosses do that,

Market Basket's small circle of shareholders — all wealthy by inheritance, and largely spared taxation thanks to voodoo economics — saw "extra" pay making employees' lives liveable and thought to themselves "that should be mine, too." Stockholders of other corporations do that all the time.

Why should any of them get away with it?

"Look — Up In the Sky"

"Helicopter complaints spur offer of free rides to City Council," read a headline in the July 31st Award-Winning Local Daily, "Businessman wants to give councilors bird's-eye view of local tourist flights."

The Herald's Jeff McMenemy reported that Seacoast Helicopters' Bruce Cultrera made his offer after Portsmouth's City Manager relayed complaints from City Councilors to the Executive director of the Pease Development Authority. The article did address the question of whether the City Attorney had weighed the propriety of an apparent offer of something of value to a city official.

"Maybe," Cultrera said, a free ride would "allay some of the rumors of hovering over neighborhoods" — as if helicopters are obnoxious only when hovering, and dozens of traversing flights every weekend are barely noticeable.

The Herald article stated accurately — see our correction on Page One — that "there are no Federal Aviation Administration regulations that dictate how low a helicopter can fly. It quoted Cultrera saying his pilots "stay at

1,000 feet because we try to be good neighbors."


Cultreta went on to say, "we don't fly directly over downtown," thereby inviting a broader discussion of exactly where the boundaries of "downtown" lie.

On a more quantifiable point, Cultrera was quoted by the *Herald* saying that when one of his helicopters flies by, "you're going to hear the noise of the helicopter for about seven seconds, then it's going to be gone." We think he's off by a factor of twelve.

Between August 1st and August 3rd, we were able to visually identify five overflights of red Robinson R-44 helicopters flying in an easterly direction, apparently crossing over the North Mill Pond at about the location of the old factory on McDonough Street. We wrote down how long each flight was audible. The times ranged from a minimum of 90 seconds to a maximum of 180. The average time was two minutes and nine seconds.

and nine Seconds.

Cultrera called this newspaper on August 2nd, to correct our reporting on the FAA's altitude regulation [See Department of Corrections, page



one]. He was so civil about our error that that we ventured to ask him what his intentions were regarding the ADS-B system we wrote about in our previous issue. (ADS-B transponders would provide an easily accessible public record giving the altitude and path of each helicopter flight.)

Cultrera said he does plan to install ADS-B equipment in his machines — when the FAA requires it in 2020.

Rough Measurements

Being by nature relentless, reasoning that if there's ever to be any control over these flights they will first have to be somehow quantified, and knowing that the tower at Pease Tradeport is staffed by air traffic controllers, we called the Airport Manager, Bill Hopper, and asked him how we might get access to whatever records the tower keeps of the takeoffs and landings there.

He directed us to the website www.gcr1.com/5010web, which holds all the available data for

every flight in and out of KPSM, aka Pease Tradeport.

Here is that data, covering the full, twelve month period ending September 30, 2013 — every blessèd bit of it: Air Carrier, 617; Air Taxi, 5,956; General Aviation Local, 19,699; General Aviation Itinerant, 2,345; Military, 7,712; Total Operations, 36,329.

Th-th-th-that's all, folks: an average of 99.5 flight operations per day, broken down into five categories.

It seems that the air traffic controllers at Pease — who are civilian employees of the Defense Department — are primarily concerned with keeping your physician's Cessna a safe distance from the Air National Guard's fuel-laden KC-135 Stratotankers. Certainly that's important; apparently, it's not easy.

The controllers count each takeoff and each landing of any aircraft — whether it be Air Force One or Bruce Cultrera's Robinson R-22 — as a single flight operation. But their records make

no distinction among them. Talk about egalitarian.

You Call That a Plan?

So, what about flight plans?

According to Hopper, if a pilot files a flight plan, then that flight plan is recorded. But flight plans are not required for flights operating under visual flight rules — as do most flights in and out of Pease. No one doing little hops such as Cultrera's training and sightseeing flights would ever bother to file a flight plan.


It seems that the only way to quantify Seacoast Helicopters' flights over Portsmouth will be to enlist and train a squad of volunteers even more demented that our alleged editor, equipped with binoculars and laptops. Perhaps one could be stationed in the North Church, and another near the tarmac at Pease

If Twain Were Alive Today

To the Editor:

In The Bohemians, a splendid new work about four pioneering western writers who set American literature in new directions, author Ben Tarnoff observes this about one of the writers, Mark

"Ever since moving East in the late 1860s, Twain had noticed a new shamelessness in American life. Nearly every day the papers carried reports of widespread corruption, from the endless scandals of Ulysses S. Grant's sleazy administration in Washington to the thuggery of Boss Tweed's Tammany machine in New York. Private greed and public crookedness conspired to create 'an era of incredible rottenness,' in Twain's phrase. Politicians bought elections, stole taxpayer dollars, and cut backroom deals with plutocrats. The country was becoming one big boomtown, an economic frontier of fast, ungovernable prosperity, and everyone wanted in on the bonanza."

As bad as things were in those days, they are immeasurably worse now, thanks in large measure to the damage wrought by George W. Bush, arguably our worst president ever, as well as to a Congress incapable of meaningful action and to a Supreme Court dominated by five shamelessly partisan ideologues.

Were he to return to life, even the great Mark Twain might not be capable of finding words ad-

equate to describe the woeful state of the Republic today. The bloated war machine sopping up desperately-needed money to repair our crumbling infrastructure, the surveillance state, unbridled corporate welfare, the rape of the middle class, kleptocrats apparently immune to well-earned prison terms - all these would likely make him think that the problems of the 1860s were trivial by comparison. permanent."

The parallels between Twain's "Gilded Age" and our own are indeed quite clear — and disgusting.

Thanks for bringing Henry George to our attention — he's such an inspiring character: born into a lower-middle class family and a school dropout at 14, he shipped out for Calcutta at 15, later became a typesetter, then eloped with his sweetheart. In his early 30s he became the editor of San Francisco Daily Evening Post, his own newspaper — the very pinnacle of success.

Now nearly forgotten, George, who lived from 1839 to 1897, was quite influential in his day. He was a major proponent of the secret, or Australian, ballot. Now almost universal, it was first adopted in Massachusetts in 1888. In his time, George was the leading proponent of the "land value tax," or single tax on land, a view which came to be called "Georgism."

His ideas inspired Elizabeth Magie to invent "The Landlord's Game," which patented in 1904 as a "practical demonstration of the pres-

ent system of land grabbing with all its usual outcomes and consequences," i.e., the enrichment of property owners and the impoverishment of tenants. Eventually Parker Brothers bought the rights and renamed the game "Monopoly."

But blinding yourself doesn't







The Gaza Ghetto

Tsrael's recent assault on Hamas-Lcontrolled Palestinian neighborhoods in the Gaza Strip followed almost directly from the June kidnapping and murder of three Israeli teenagers in the West Bank. A rocket salvo offered the immediate pretense, but such attacks happen frequently without igniting disproportionate retaliation. Without the orchestrated social-media campaign over the three young victims, which included the cultivation of a vengeful spirit, the current Israeli incursion in Gaza would not have been likely.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu claims to have indisputable evidence that the murderers were members of Hamas, but his refusal to share that evidence engenders much doubt. It may be true, but it is also true that Netanyahu's soldiers randomly beat, jail, or kill young Palestinians — sometimes in nothing less than murder. Nevertheless, the three young Jewish martyrs provided his excuse for an all-out attack on Gaza, a troublesome Palestinian ghetto that Israel has been blockading for years, with the obvious intent of starving it into extinction.

The frenzy that gripped Israelis over the three murdered boys contrasted starkly with the ennui that attends the killing of unarmed and often unoffending Palestinians by Israeli Defense Forces. Last March, guards on the Jordanian border shot a 38-yearold Palestinian to death, claiming he attacked them; turned out he was a Jordanian citizen, and a judge, but the guards stuck to their story, insisting that the standard video cameras at the crossing had "malfunctioned." On May 15, during a protest outside Ofer Prison, where hundreds of young Palestinians are detained without charges, Israeli guards shot and killed two Palestinian boys who were simply walking past the prison: you can see the videotape. They had no weapons, but perhaps they shouted insults that justify murder.

On June 22, while Israeli soldiers were ransacking Palestinian homes in the West Bank for "evidence" of the kidnapped trio, they killed two Palestinian boys, including one who was mentally ill. On July 1, persons unknown in Jerusalem kidnapped a 16-year-old Palestinian boy and apparently burned him alive. A couple of

days later two masked, uniformed Israeli police were caught on tape beating and kicking a 15-year-old Palestinian who, incidentally, is an American citizen. Just google "Israeli police beat Palestinian boy" to see it. From the looks of him, they worked him over quite a bit more after they got him to jail. These stories get short shrift from most Israeli news media, and little evident sympathy from the Israeli public (or, it seems, from the kid's congresswoman, Kathy Castor, who evinces the average American politician's horror of offending Israel).

"Anyone trying to harm Israeli citizens will be harmed in turn," warned Netanyahu on June 16. The beating his goons gave the Florida kid without a peep from Barack Obama, suggests that our president does not feel quite so strongly about his own citizens. Obama's response is to insist that Israel "has the right to defend itself"— I suppose in the same way several L.A. policemen defended themselves against Rodney King. Money talks, and evidently Israeli lobbyists spent enough to buy the president whose 2009 Cairo speech pretended such friendliness toward the Moslem world.

Given the origins of Netan-

yahu's country, it's tempting to compare his Israel to Hitler's Germany. Hardline Israelis' devotion to ethnic-based nationalism echoes eerily of the Nazi yawp of the 1930s, especially when combined with the practice of confining those lesser humans in squalid ghettoes. Using a single unsolved crime as an excuse for the latest onslaught against Hamas brings to mind Hermann Goering crushing his communist rivals over the Reichstag fire - which he later claimed to have set. Israel violates international law and United Nations resolutions with impunity, much as the Third Reich gobbled up lebensraum unimpeded until 1939. Through its "Ambassadors Online" program, Israel has nurtured a vast network of pro-Zionist bloggers, whose pervasive propaganda would have made Joseph Goebbels drool: probably this column will inspire something from them.

Still, the Nazi analogy does not fit well — yet. For instance, Israeli oppression stops short of mass murder, unless you count artillery fire on civilian neighborhoods. A more obvious parallel is the stealthy, piecemeal genocide of indigenous Americans by European invaders. By dint of successive wars the white man eventually took all the desirable land, killing only when the Indian refused to move on, or when there was nowhere else to move. Those wars usually started over some raid by a party of angry, frustrated, outgunned braves who had been pushed too far, whereupon the white "victims" attacked the entire tribe. By 1890 the last Indian resistance had been crushed, and the few survivors were corralled on dismal reservations, not unlike the West Bank and Gaza.

A glance at maps showing the disappearance of Palestinian land since the creation of Israel will explain why Netanyahu and his type are happy to delay or confound any peace accord. So little land is left to Palestinians, thanks to the proliferation of illegal Israeli settlements in the occupied lands, that soon there won't be any room for the Palestinian half of a twostate solution, which most people outside Israel recognize as the only solution possible. Once the last Palestinians have been driven onto their last hectare of land, heroic Israelis like the police who pummeled the helpless Florida kid can stage their own "battle" of Wounded Knee, solving their ethnic clash the same way we did.

the latest eye catching headline on July 25 in the Associated Press, "U.S. says Russia is taking military action against Ukraine." Surely the Obama administration must have "bullet-proof" evidence to make such a damning claim that Russia is "firing artillery from its territory into Ukraine." gence information' but [the State Dept.official] declined to elaborate...." Really, "some intelligence information" with no proof to show to the world? the Ukrainian ambassador to the U.S. on this and asked him for "what evidence do you have?" He had none. The following day, but not reported on CNN, the Kiev government retracted its allegations accusing Russia of shooting down its aircraft.

Hundreds of people have been killed in recent weeks in eastern Ukraine, many of them innocent civilians, and yet our press has hardly mentioned this and the relentless artillery shelling and bombing by the Kiev government in this region. Our government vilified Saddam Hussein, Bashar Assad, and Muammar Gaddafi for "killing their own people." Yet, far-right fascist paramilitary groups, full of raw hatred for ethnic Russians, are now leading the

Ukraine "national guard" that is attacking the ethnic Russians in eastern Ukraine. The Kiev government, fully supported by the Obama administration, is killing its own people. The former prime minister Yulia Tymoshenko, who was the runner up in the recent presidential election, is on record for wanting to "nuke" all the ethnic Russians in Ukraine. Yes, there

ne public service that people really like and count on is the post office — which literally delivers for us.

To add to Congress' cockamamie-ness, the service is being forced to put up all of that money within just 10 years which has been costing U.S.P.S. more than \$5 billion a year. 





Admiral Fowle's Piscataqua River Tidal Guide (Not for Navigational Purposes)

Portsmouth, arguably the first town in this country not founded by religious extremists, is bounded on the north and east by the Piscataqua River, the second, third, or fourth fastest-flowing navigable river in the country, depending on

whom you choose to believe. The Piscataqua's ferocious current is caused by the tide, which, in turn, is caused by the moon. The other player is a vast sunken valley — Great Bay — about ten miles upriver. Twice a day, the

moon drags about seventeen billion gallons of seawater — enough to fill 2,125,000 tanker trucks — up the river and into Great Bay. This creates a roving hydraulic conflict, as incoming sea and the outgoing river collide. The skirmish line

moves from the mouth of the river, up past New Castle, around the bend by the old Naval Prison, under Memorial Bridge, past the tugboats, and on into Great Bay. This can best be seen when the tide

Twice a day, too, the moon lets all that water go. All the seawater that just fought its way upstream goes back home to the ocean. This is when the Piscataqua earns its title for xth fastest current. Look for the red buoy, at the upstream

end of Badger's Island, bobbing around in the current. It weighs several tons, and it bobs and

bounces in the current like a cork. The river also has its placid moments, around high and low tides. When the river rests, its tugboats

and bridges work their hardest. Ships coming in laden with coal, oil, and salt do so at high tide, for more clearance under their keels. They leave empty, riding high in the water, at low tide, to squeeze under Memorial Bridge.


